



A Place of Our Own

Abused Deaf Women's Advocacy Services

A Place of Our Own provides service-enriched housing for Deaf/Deaf-Blind women and families who have experienced domestic violence. The mixed-use project includes 19 units of transitional housing and six units of emergency shelter, office space for the ADWAS agency and support services, and common areas for residents. A Place of Our Own is the nation's first housing project to be designed specifically to meet the accessibility and security needs of this population, and will serve as a model for ADWAS' sister organizations around the country.
